Our History is Preserved

- When a congregation closes its doors, how will a member's descendent know when her great-grandfather was baptized? What happens to those kinds of documents and congregational artifacts when congregations go out of existence?



That's where the Lutheran Archives Center comes in.

When St. Peter, Easton, closed recently, the congregation's records went to the Lutheran Archives Center at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia.

Thanks to you and your gifts, personal papers, congregational records, and archives of Lutheran synods and church bodies in the northeast are preserved for all time in the Center.

Recognized as part of the church organization in 1792, the Center is part of a network of nine regional archives programs and a churchwide archives program in the ELCA.

Housed at the new Brossman Learning Center, the Center is open by appointment Tuesdays through Fridays, 1 to 4 p.m. A professional archivist is available to help with your questions.
